Read Eric Carle's book to find out.	14 Talk How many yellow things are there in your wardrobe? Talk about the different colours you can see.	<b>15 Sing</b> Sing-a-long Wednesday! Music makes words easier to remember. Sing songs with your child every day.	<b>16</b> Write Plan a trip to the beach and draw letters and shapes in the sand.	<b>17 Play</b> Can you make a block tower taller than your own body?	18ReadIt's Story Saturday!Read Pete the Cat: ILove My White Shoesby Eric Litwin.
<b>19 STEM</b> It's STEM Sunday! Look up at the sky tonight. Can you see the moon? If you can, talk about what shape it is.	20 Read Screen time is not recommended for children under 2 years, but sharing books together is perfect!	21 Talk When your baby babbles, repeat the sounds, turn them into words and encourage with smiles.	22 Sing Sing-a-long Wednesday! Sing <u>The Wheels on the</u> <u>Bus</u> together. Talk about bus rides you and your child have taken.	23 Write Using scissors is a great way to build hand strength. If paper is too hard to cut, try cutting playdough.	24 Play Play lays the foundation for literacy. Children practice sounds and new words as they play.	25 Read It's Story Saturday! Borrow a factual book about your favourite Australian animal at your local library.
<b>26 STEM</b> It's STEM Sunday! Gather soft items such as a teddy bear, a pillow, a beach towel. How are they the same? How are they different?	27 Read It's Lewis Carroll's Birthday today. Read a version of <i>Alice in</i> <i>Wonderland</i> together.	28 Talk Talk about the things you need when you go to the beach and add some silly things too! "Do we need gumboots or a towel?"	<b>29 Sing</b> Sing-a-long Wednesday! Find out when Rhyme Time is happening at your local public library and join in!	<b>30</b> Write Read a recipe and make something delicious together. Name the tools you use as you cook together.	<b>31 Play</b> Play with toy animals and have fun making the animal noises and saying animal names.	Substitute any titles you can't find or songs you don't know with books, rhymes, and songs that you already love.
